



de luxe TROLLEY - STAND



Specification

This superb stand has been specially designed for use by both amateurs and professionals in every sphere of sub-standard activity— Mobile Cinemas, Educational Establishments, Hospitals and like institutions, Industrial Organisations, Cinematograph Clubs and Societies, and of course the home.

It is suitable for use with all sub-standard film projectors, filmstrip projectors, epidiascopes and diascopes at present manufactured.

It is constructed of stout gauge sheet metal reinforced with cross members thus ensuring absolute rigidity in use. It is fitted with both castors and fine screw adjustable feet; the former for mobility and the latter to enable the stand to be used on irregular floor surfaces and to maintain absolute rigidity during projection. The feet which when in use disengage the castors, are independently adjustable thus ensuring perfect picture alignment; they are also rounded thus eliminating indentations and damage to delicate floor coverings.

The stand itself consists of three platforms. The top one to take the projector (size 21" x 13") has a fine thread adjustment from 7° below to 7° above the horizontal for achieving the correct angle of projection. The centre platform $(18" \times 12")$ is primarily a slotted spool rack to take four 1600 feet spools of film, though it can be used for spares, tools etc. The bottom platform (20" x 14") is suitable for housing the electrical equipment and accessories.

The stand is 4ft. 2in. in height thus allowing the projector beam to clear the heads of the audience. It is remarkably light, compact and portable when closed, in which position it is retained by two side hooks. It is easily assembled or closed from one position to the other in a matter of seconds.

It is elegant in design, attractive in appearance and very moderate in cost.
